Dear Student:

Congratulations on being accepted to North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University. Now that you have chosen to become an Aggie, we offer you the opportunity to get a head start on your success by applying to the 2014 Aggie Impact Scholars Program (AISP).

The Aggie Impact Scholars Program prepares a selected group of entering freshmen for success at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University. This success relies heavily on preparation for the academic rigor, social pressures, and general expectations of undergraduate education. We strongly believe that we can take full advantage of the University's summer session to ease the high school to college transition that all freshmen encounter. Students selected to participate will have been admitted to North Carolina A&T and are expected to attend the University in the fall.

This challenging and rewarding program is a six-week, residential opportunity that will occur June 22, 2014 until August 1, 2014. Each participant receives the equivalent of a \$3,500 summer scholarship – thus the reason we call those selected to participate Aggie Impact Scholars. In essence, A&T is investing in assuring your success as an Aggie.

Aggie Impact Scholars will enroll in a college English and mathematics course for six hours of college credit. Grades earned will be included on the official A&T transcript and contribute to the overall grade point average.

AISP also partners with TRiO Student Support Services (SSS), a federally funded program of the U.S. Department of Education, to provide enrichment, cultural, social, and other activities offered through AISP. Any student who is accepted into AISP and meets the eligibility criteria for Student Support Services will automatically be accepted into the SSS program.

Enclosed are the Aggie Impact Scholars Program application, an information sheet about the SSS program, and the SSS Interest Application-Summer Bridge form. The application process also requires you to submit a personal statement of no more than one typed page about yourself and why you desire this opportunity along with two (2) reference letters and a recent photo of yourself. The photo will help us prepare for the arrival of those selected and will not be returned.

TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

What is TRiO Student Support Services?

TRIO is a set of seven federally-funded educational opportunity outreach programs and one staff training program that seeks to motivate and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds, namely low-income, first-generation students. TRIO programs, currently serving nearly 850,000 students from middle school through post-graduate study across America, provide academic tutoring, personal counseling, mentoring, financial guidance, and other supports necessary for educational access and retention. TRIO programs provide direct support services for students, and relevant training for directors and staff. Student Support Services (SSS) is one of the seven TRIO programs, which have been in existence since the 1960's. Their goal is help students to overcome class, social, academic, and cultural barriers to higher education.

Student Support Services provides services that are designed to:

- Enhance the overall college experience of eligible students at no cost to program participants.
- Serve as a resource for eligible students to ensure that they are achieving at their highest level.
- Increase college retention and graduation rates for first-generation, low-income, and disabled students.
- Foster an institution climate supportive of the success of eligible students who are either first-generation students, low-income and individuals with disabilities.
- Ensure that each student in our program graduates and goes on to pursue post-secondary educational opportunities.

- Informational Sessions/Study Skills
- GRE Prep
- Tutors/Supplemental Instructors
- Cultural Activities
- Counseling

The Student Support Services program serves eligible and enrolled students who want to make the most of their education while attending North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University. Our staff is aware of the many obstacles that can hinder performance in college. The SSS program provides guidance, encouragement, and a variety of academic and support services. SSS staff works one-on-one and with small groups to guide students toward the successful completion of their course of study while monitoring student academic progress and providing assistance needed for success.
